During the picnic there was games, songs, dance and good food. The ambience was invigorating and everyone came back with good vibes.








NATIONAL LEVEL SPECIAL EDUCATORS MEET




On 25th March, 2023 during YAAR some of the participants gave their opinion on barriers to inclusion in our society.



OUTREACH PROGRAM

During the last 3 months ASWB has been spreading awareness at grassroots level more intensively. There are two areas, Sonarpur, 2 No. Gram Panchayat, district - 24 Pgs. (South) & another at Mukundapur, Kolkata, Ward no. 109 we have reached around 500 people with the support of local educational institutions like ICDS (Integrated Child Development Schemes) centers & primary & secondary level govt. & private schools & the local governance, like gram panchayat. As part of our 'Reaching Out' programme, Autism Society West Bengal also collaborated with Integrated Child Development Schemes centres at South 24 Parganas especially at Sonarpur. On 20th January, 2023 our first orientation programme was organized at Gopalpur centre with Ms Chandrani Chakraborty (Special Educator & In charge of Early Intervention Unit, ASWB) and Ms Joyita Mangal (Special Educator, ASWB) along with Ms Binita Chakraborty (Project Coordinator, ASWB)and Piyali Chakrabarty (Programme coordinator, ASWB). Through this orientation programme we were able to reach out to **52** individuals.

Similar orientation programmes were organized at Natagachi and Ramchandrapur ICDS centres on 10th & 14th February, 2023. Mr Manoj Kumar Mahato (Special educator & D.Ed core Faculty), Ms Amrita Bhawal (Special Educator, ASWB) with Ms Binita Chakraborty (Project Coordinator, ASWB) and Ms Piyali Chakraborty (Programme Coordinator, ASWB). were part of the orientation programmes. We were able to reach total **80** individuals at Natagachi and Ramchandrapur.






MUKUNDAPUR, KOLKATA, WARD NO. 109




